## QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY BIOLOGICAL STATION

### Group Users Agreement & Waiver Queen's University Biological Station (QUBS)

Thank you for using the Queen's University Biological Station. <u>All users must abide by the rules set out for this facility</u>. Please carefully read the statements listed below and refer to the Queen's University Biological Station Users Guide (<u>https://qubs.ca/booking/user-guidelines</u>):

- Use only the Raleigh J. Robertson Biodiversity Centre, Jessie V. Deslauriers Biology Centre, your designated cabin or cottage, your designated labs, and the dock and other common areas.
- Users are expected to leave cabins at least as clean as they found them.
- Place all garbage, compost and recyclables in the appropriate receptacles (Recycling centre near Workshop).
- Campfires are only permitted within the designated fire pit at Earl Cottage when weather conditions permit.
- Outside firewood cannot be brought onto the property. Speak to the management before setting a fire in the designated fire pits to ensure that the fire risk is acceptable given local conditions.
- Dogs and other pets are not allowed in any of the buildings at Queen's Point.
- Alcohol consumption must be done responsibly and not to excess. Alcohol is not permitted in labs or library. Failure to comply will result in removal from the premises. Alcohol use must follow the Queen's University alcohol policy: (<u>https://www.queensu.ca/secretariat/policies/administration-and-operations/queens-universityalcohol-policy</u>).
- The kitchen is strictly off-limits unless invited by QUBS staff. All dishes should be promptly placed in the dishwashing area after meals.
- Mealtimes are 7:30 am, 12:00 noon and 5:30 pm. Meals can be set aside if requested in advance.
- All Station vehicles including tractors, pick-up trucks, golf carts and ATVs are to be used by QUBS staff approved by Queen's Insurance and management.
- Users swim in Lake Opinicon or other lakes on our lands at their own risk. Similarly, all other hiking trails are also at the users' own risk.
- No firearms are allowed on QUBS Point.
- All users of watercraft must use PFDs and carry a boat kit. Users of motorboats must carry a Pleasure Craft Operator Card.
- All fishing must be done within season and with a valid fishing licence.
- The main phone in the Raleigh J. Robertson Biodiversity Centre is for emergency use only; please leave the line free for QUBS staff. Do not make long-distance calls.
- Vehicles must not block any roads, access points or fire routes.
- Users of WiFi service should not stream large videos and must not access illegal streaming sites.
- Do not undertake any activity that will cause damage to habitat (including topographic features) or harassment / injury to any living organism.
- No unauthorized use of research equipment/materials stored on-site.

Note that QUBS is a shared facility and thus we request that you keep noise to a minimum and keep common areas clean and uncluttered. There is a curfew on noise between 11:00pm and 7:00 am.

- All children under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.
- All patrons are expected to behave in a sensible and respectful manner at all times.
- Visitors are allowed as space permits, but users must notify the managers and kitchen staff.

I acknowledge that my activities on the property are purely optional, as I requested this short-term license for use. I understand that it is my responsibility to ensure that all members of my group abide by all applicable Queen's University (hereafter the University), and the Queen's University Biological Station (hereafter QUBS), and to ensure that I, and all members of my group, have adequate medical, personal health, dental and accident insurance coverage, as well as protection of our personal possessions. In particular, I understand that the University, and QUBS do not carry accident or injury insurance for our benefit and also that there may be certain matters for which I, or members of my group, could be held at fault personally if our activities or conduct fall short of what would be considered a reasonable standard for an individual in our position. In all cases I agree to be accountable in all respects for my own actions, as well as for those of my group, and not to ask the University, QUBS, or their employees or officers to accept the consequences thereof; further, I, and members of my group, agree to be responsible for any claims made against the University, or QUBS in relation to such actions, and if damage is caused by our use of the facilities, we agree to cover all costs for repairs.

### APPENDIX A

### HAZARDS, DANGERS, and RISK of INJURY inherent during this EVENT

Hazard	Risk
Extreme heat	<ul> <li>In the summer months, consequences to visitors can include heat stroke, exhaustion, head-aches, sunburns; episodes of light headedness, fainting, chest discomfort, leg cramps, nausea and fatigue. Signs of excessive heat must be reported and never ignored. Every <b>PARTICIPANT</b> should bring sun protection such as sunscreen, a hat, <i>etc.</i></li> </ul>
Dehydration	<ul> <li>Visitors will be outside and active much of the day. There is a risk of dehydration, resulting in headaches, episodes of light headedness, fainting, chest discomfort, leg cramps, nausea and fatigue if inadequate amounts of water are consumed. Every <b>PARTICIPANT</b> should bring adequate water</li> </ul>
Hypothermia	<ul> <li>Visitors may experience cool, wet days</li> <li>Without proper clothing, there is a risk of hypothermia</li> <li>A boat could be capsized and visitors or staff could spend some time in the water, resulting in cold wet clothes. Every <b>PARTICIPANT</b> should bring a dry changes of clothes</li> </ul>
Extreme cold	<ul> <li>In the winter months, consequences to visitors can include frostnip, frostbite, and if symptoms are ignored, excessive loss of body heat can lead to hypothermia. Every <b>PARTICIPANT</b> should wear proper winter clothing</li> </ul>
Rough & slippery terrain	<ul> <li>The terrain at Elbow Lake is rugged, often with loose debris or exposed wet rock. The terrain can be steep, uneven or slippery, with branches, rocks, or other obstacles present risks of slipping and falling that may result in bone and muscular skeletal injury, such as breaks, sprains and strains, or broken limbs, concussion or spinal cord injuries</li> <li>This risk is increased in the winter months with the addition of snow and ice.</li> </ul>
Insect bites & stings	<ul> <li>Visitors are at risk of being stung/bit by insects, including bees, mosquitoes, flies, and ticks.</li> <li>While this is primarily just an inconvenience it could pose a serious problem for people with allergies, if the tick is infected with Lyme disease, or if the mosquito is a West Nile Virus carrier. Every <b>PARTICIPANT</b> must advise <b>EVENT</b> organizers of <b>any allergies</b> to insect bites and stings and carry, or provide staff with, their <b>EpiPen</b></li> <li>The threat of ticks can exist throughout the year in any season, not just summer.</li> </ul>
Lightening and wind storms	<ul> <li>There is a risk of storms, including lightening and high winds.</li> <li>There is a risk of being struck by lightning or being hit by falling tree branches or other debris.</li> </ul>
Swimming accident	• There is a possibility that a visitor could be injured while swimming (e.g., cramps, cuts, <i>etc.</i> )
Watercraft accident	There is a possibility of capsizing in canoes, kayaks, and row boats.
Wildlife	<ul> <li>Visitors may encounter wildlife, including raccoons, porcupines, squirrels, skunks, deer, bears, etc.</li> <li>Under most circumstances, wildlife will stay away from visitors and won't present a risk</li> <li>However, wildlife can be unpredictable and may respond aggressively to visitors (biting, charging, spraying). PARTICIPANTS are prohibited from attempting to engage or interact with any wildlife</li> </ul>
Getting lost	<ul> <li>Visitors will explore areas (trails, wetlands, lakeshore) beyond the building envelope.</li> <li>There is the possibility of becoming lost or disoriented. PARTICIPANTS must stay with and follow the instructions of the EVENT Staff.</li> </ul>
